Led by a group of volunteers, we are honoured to have the participation of students from local schools to sing, play music, recite poems and tell us about the all too-short history of those 13 men. Together, we observe a moment of silence in reverence for all those who gave the ultimate sacrifice. And as a final tribute, community members and members of the Armed Forces lay wreaths at the foot of the Cenotaph.
